# 5 ways to help students become better Questioners

## 1. Make it safe

Use post-it-note activities, exit slips, or backchannel discussions for sharing questions.

“Asking a question can be scary.”



## 2. Make it cool

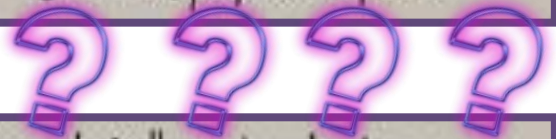
Publish the best questions. Have a question hall-of-fame. Students will love reading these especially from other classes- “Who asked this? Who said that?”



## 3. Make it fun

Let students tap into their imaginations and innate question-asking skills in ways that make inquiry an engaging part of a larger challenge.

“What if we could help students UNDERSTAND that the people who ask questions happen to be some of the COOLEST people on the planet?”



## 4. Make it rewarding

Give praise and reward for good questions. Encourage students to clap remarkable questions.

“Help to create a path for students to get from question to a meaningful result.”

## 5. Make it stick

The more authentic and non-academic the great questions are, and the more often they're revisited (naturally and authentically), the more they will stick.
